If we neglect personal and public worship on a consistent basis and neglect being generous with our time, talents, and treasures—especially when we know what God's will is for His children—we need to take a careful look at our relationship with God.

The Power of a Father – A TRANSCENDENT CAUSE – Colossians 1:15-18.

- A transcendent cause is a mission that lifts us beyond ourselves, a passion that stirs us to self-sacrifice and causes us to contribute to the larger community. A transcendent cause is not something we do in addition to everything else; instead, it is the one factor that motivates everything we do. Put in the simplest terms, we want our lives to count for something important.
- 2. Three characteristics of a transcendent cause:
 - 1. Must be _____→ a noble endeavor calling forth bravery and sacrifice. Therefore, fathers need to give sons conviction, rather than marketplace competence.
 - 2. Must be _____ → It contains significance beyond the moment. Therefore, fathers need to give sons spiritual significance, rather than social success.
 - 3. Must be ______→ It pulsates with meaning. Therefore, fathers need to give sons the best things, rather than good things.

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Genesis 28:10-22 - 10 Jacob left Beersheba and went to Haran.11 He came to a certain place and camped for the night since the sun had set. He took one of the stones there, set it under his head and lay down to sleep.12 And he dreamed: A stairway was set on the ground and it reached all the way to the sky; angels of God were going up and going down on it.13 Then God was right before him, saying, "I am God, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac. I'm giving the ground on which you are sleeping to you and to your descendants.14 Your descendants will be as the dust of the Earth; they'll stretch from west to east and from north to south. All the families of the Earth will bless themselves in you and your descendants.15 Yes. I'll stay with you, I'll protect you wherever you go, and I'll bring you back to this very ground. I'll stick with you until I've done everything I promised you."16 Jacob woke up from his sleep. He said, "God is in this place - truly. And I didn't even know it!"<u>17</u> He was terrified. He whispered in awe, "Incredible. Wonderful. Holy. This is God's House. This is the Gate of Heaven."18 Jacob was up first thing in the morning. He took the stone he had used for his pillow and stood it up as a memorial pillar and poured oil over it.19 He christened the place Bethel (God's House). The name of the town had been Luz until then.20 Jacob vowed a vow: "If God stands by me and protects me on this journey on which I'm setting out, keeps me in food and clothing, 21 and brings me back in one piece to my father's house, this God will be my God.22 This stone that I have set up as a memorial pillar will mark this as a place where God lives. And everything you give me, I'll return a tenth to you."

<u>John 1:11, 12 - 11</u> He came to his own people, but they didn't want him. <u>12</u> But whoever did want him, who believed he was who he claimed and would do what he said, He made to be their true selves, their child-of-God selves.

Ephesians 2:7-10 - 7 Now God has us where he wants us, with all the time in this world and the next to shower grace and kindness upon us in Christ Jesus.8 Saving is all his idea, and all his work. All we do is trust him enough to let him do it. It's God's gift from start to finish!9 We don't play the major role. If we did, we'd probably go around bragging that we'd done the whole thing!10 No, we neither make nor save ourselves. God does both the making and saving. He creates each of us by Christ Jesus to join him in the work he does, the good work he has gotten ready for us to do, work we had better be doing.

<u>Colossians 1:15-18 - 15</u> We look at this Son and see the God who cannot be seen. We look at this Son and see God's original purpose in everything created. <u>16</u> For everything, absolutely everything, above and below, visible and invisible, rank after rank after rank of angels - everything got started in him and finds its purpose in him.<u>17</u> He was there before any of it came into existence and holds it all together right up to this moment.<u>18</u> And when it comes to the church, he organizes and holds it together, like a head does a body.
