	1.	\rightarrow When we violate the will of God in our lives, we always experience the natural
		consequences of our sins.
	2.	\rightarrow God sometimes allows us to suffer the consequences of
		our sins so that we might understand the pain we've caused in others' lives, and this understanding will create in us the desire to draw
		closer to God and treat others in a more Christlike manner.
	3.	→ No matter who or what caused the consequences of sin in our lives, God wants
		us to view pain and suffering as a means to be able to connect more effectively to others who are experiencing the same difficulties.
	4.	\rightarrow No matter the cause of our pain and suffering and regardless of the results in our lives, God
		forgives the sins of the past. When God forgives us, He sees us as a loving Father to a beloved son—like He saw Jesus.

 - → a code of conduct. <u>INTIMACY</u> (Hosea 6:6). <u>SERVANT-LEADERSHIP</u> (Matthew 20:26,27). <u>KINDNESS</u> (Proverbs 19:22). <u>HUMILITY</u> (Philippians 2:3). <u>PURITY</u> (I Timothy 4:12). <u>HONESTY</u> (Ephesians 4:25). <u>SELF-DISCIPLINE</u> (I Timothy 4:7, 8). <u>EXCELLENCE</u> (I Corinthians 9:24). <u>INTEGRITY</u> (Proverbs 10:9). <u>PERSEVERANCE</u> (Galatians 6:9).
 - 3. → a transcendent cause. A transcendent cause is a mission that lifts us beyond ourselves, a passion that stirs us to self-sacrifice and causes us to contribute to the larger community. A transcendent cause is not something we do in addition to everything else; instead, it is the one factor that motivates everything we do.
